Mecklenburg Transportation System (MTS)

The Mecklenburg Transportation System (MTS) provides a variety of transportation services to Mecklenburg County residents

How to Apply for Services

Medicaid funded transportation: contact your Medicaid social worker.

- Veterans Transportation: call the Veterans Service Office (704-336-2102).
- For transportation to a nutrition site, homebound meal delivery, to a medical facility, or any other location, contact the MTS Transportation Services Line (704-336-4547).

Description of Programs and Eligibility Provided by MTS: Medicaid Transportation

Adults and children authorized to receive Medicaid transportation are transported to and from a medical destination. CATS bus service is the primary mode of transportation. When the person cannot ride the bus, door-to-door transportation is provided. A Medicaid Transportation Exception Form (5048) is required. Cost: No fare.

<u>Elderly Disabled Transportation Assistance (EDTAP)</u> Adults aged 60+ and children and adults with a disability are transported to and from dialysis, chemotherapy or other medical appointments. Cost: \$1.50 fare per one-way trip.

Elderly General Purpose (EGP) Transportation

Adults aged 60+ that are not living in an assisted living facility or nursing home or persons with disabilities (SSI, SSA Disability, Veterans Disability) are transported to and from medical appointments, grocery shopping, and Mecklenburg County Park and Recreation /Senior Centers. Cost: \$1.50 fare per one-way trip. \$10.00 for a monthly bus pass.

Rural General Public (RGP) Transportation

Either the origin or destination of the trip must be in the non-urbanized area of Mecklenburg County for persons of any age. Door to door service is provided or passengers may choose to be taken from the non-urbanized location to a local Charlotte Area Transit System (CATS) bus stop location. Cost: \$1.50 fare per one-way trip.

Senior Citizens Nutrition Congregate (SCNP)

Transportation provided directly by MTS for adults aged 60+ to and from Mecklenburg County Senior Citizens Nutrition sites for a nutritious meal and social activities. This service is provided directly by MTS drivers. Cost: No fare. Contributions are accepted but not required.

Veterans Services Transportation

Qualified veterans are transported to and from Veterans Affairs hospitals in North Carolina and to and from medical clinics in Charlotte. Call the Veterans Services Office at 704-336-2102 for more information. Cost: No fare.
